Belize Mission Trip

Our church wide mission trip to Belize is scheduled for December 27, 2015 – January 2, 2016. We will be staying and working in central Belize in Belmopan. The total cost of the trip is \$1,100.00. We are taking \$100.00 deposits beginning now through February 1st. An additional \$500.00 will be due May 31, 2015 with the remaining balance due November 8, 2015. There may be some fundraising opportunities for the group, but mainly the cost is the responsibility of the participant.
